

Appendix E: Abuses Documented by Human Rights Watch

Number of domestic workers interviewed: 51
 Ages of domestic workers interviewed: 17-37

Because of the restrictions on domestic workers' movements and the limited time some had to participate in an interview, some domestic workers were not able to respond to all of the points below. The numbers presented here most likely under-represent the actual number of abuses among the fifty-one women and girls interviewed. In addition, those who were currently working often did not know yet if they would receive their full salary on completion of their standard two-year contract.
