Dear Senior General Than Shwe:

We wish to convey our serious concern regarding the treatment and continued detention of American citizen Kyaw Zaw Lwin (a.k.a. Nyi Nyi Aung). We urge the Burmese Government to act in a manner that is consistent with its own legal obligations and those of international law, immediately release Mr. Aung, and allow him to return to the United States.

On September 3, 2009, your government arrested Mr. Aung at the Rangoon airport, and he is currently on trial for fraud and forgery relating to his alleged use of a fraudulent Burmese national identification card and for allegedly illegally importing Burmese and U.S. currency into the country. Mr. Aung was initially charged with violations of various national security laws, which were published in a highly detailed article in your state-run *New Light of Myanmar*. Yet all of those initial charges were dropped, and Mr. Aung was then charged with new offenses, none of which were supported by the alleged facts reported in the article. As a result, we can only conclude that the new charges are pretextual and are, in fact, a direct result of Mr. Aung's longstanding non-violent activities in support of freedom and democracy in Burma.

Based on information relayed by the U.S. Embassy in Rangoon, it appears that Mr. Aung's detention and trial are inconsistent with both Burmese and international law. First, in violation of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, to which Burma is a party, government authorities denied Mr. Aung consular access for seventeen days. Second, in violation of the *jus cogens* prohibition against torture, government authorities deprived Mr. Aung of food and sleep for more than a week, beat him, and denied him medical treatment. Third, government authorities are denying Mr. Aung's right under Burmese law to regular access to counsel and a public trial.

On Friday, December 11, we heard the distressing news that Mr. Aung's trial was canceled due to unexplained "health reasons," and that U.S. Embassy has been denied access to see him. As you know, Mr. Aung has been on a hunger strike to protest the conditions of political prisoners in Burma since December 4, and there are reports that his health is seriously deteriorating.

The detention of an American citizen under these circumstances has caused alarm among many Members of the United States Congress, and raises serious doubts about your government's willingness to improve relations with the United States.

We urge you in the strongest possible terms to immediately and unconditionally release Mr. Aung and allow him to return to the United States.

We believe that the way to move forward for Burma and for our bilateral relations is to release all political prisoners, including Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, and begin the process of genuine political reconciliation before next year's election.
